Open with A Prayer

The meeting was called to order, and Donovan Tucker led in prayer. Mayor Evans requested all in attendance to stand for the Pledge of Allegiance.

City Council Minutes

New Business:

1. Resolution 2026-077 - Background Check Policy

2. Resolution 2026-078 - Water Board Appointment

Baird made a motion to approve Resolution 2026-078-Water Board Appointment. Estep seconded the motion. A roll call was made. Evans "Aye" Estep "Aye", Baird "Aye". Passed 3-0.

3. City Attorney Discussion

Jody Dorris has informed the city that he is no longer interested in being the city attorney because his workload is now too heavy. He said he will handle anything until the city can find a replacement. Per the city charter, the city board sets the salary for the city attorney. A resolution has been sent Jody for reviewal to start the process in September. He is on vacation and will get back to us at the start of next week.

Public Comments:

Dennis and Shannon Beam were present. They stated that their neighbor at 212 S Adams Street has been tearing up the road by doing burnouts. Dennis picked up a handful of steel belts and rubber from tires. Dennis also noted that he would like the road to be repaved and that there are no street signs, a yield sign or stop sign on his road.

Mayor Evans advised them to call Robertson County Sheriff's Department if it happens again. Evans also stated that the signs would be taken care of.

Fire Department:

Chief Tucker was present, no items to present.

Recreation Club:

Evans stated that their lawn mower isn't working and needs to be looked at.

City Manager Anna Redfern stated that they are supposed to be presenting plans for the batting cage to have it covered and widened.

Reports From Staff:**1. Ball Tournament for High School Softball Team**

Anna Redfern asked them to attend the meeting, yet they didn't come. They were inquiring about use of the grounds in September or October. Evans suggested they wait till spring due to the grounds being occupied by CSI during that time frame in the fall. If they wanted to do something next year, they need to be looking at dates now.

2. Fall Festival - Megan Baird

Baird stated that her plans are to have a festival on Saturday October 31st from 2-6, with truck or treat being from 5-6. Baird would also like to have a big tent with tables and chairs. She priced a tent with Guerreros in Springfield that cost around \$1000. Baird would also like to have pumpkins for the kids to paint. City manager mentioned that is within the budget for fall festival.
